WORLD HERITAGE SITE DEFINITION

a natural or man-made site, area, or structure recognized as being of outstanding international importance and therefore as deserving special protection. Sites are nominated to and designated by the World Heritage Convention (an organization of UNESCO).

UNESCO Convention 1972



1972 CONVENTION CONCERNING THE PROTECTION OF THE WORLD CULTURAL AND NATURAL HERITAGE:

Designed to ensure the identification, protection, conservation, presentation and transmission of cultural and natural heritage to future generations, this Convention recognizes the way in which people interact with nature, and the fundamental need to preserve the balance between the two.
